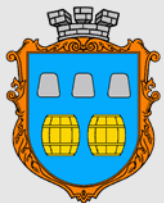

Solotvyn settlement is the administrative center of the Solotvyn Territorial Community, located on the banks of the Bystrytsia Solotvynska River in the foothills of the Gorgany mountain range.

According to the administrative-territorial division, the Solotvyn Settlement Council is part of the Ivano-Frankivsk District of the Ivano-Frankivsk Region. The Solotvyn Settlement Council borders the Bohorodchany, Dzvyniach, and Nadvirna communities. Transport Logistics:

- 40 km to Ivano-Frankivsk;
- 22 km to the nearest railway station in Nadvirna
- 257 km to the Ukrainian-Polish border

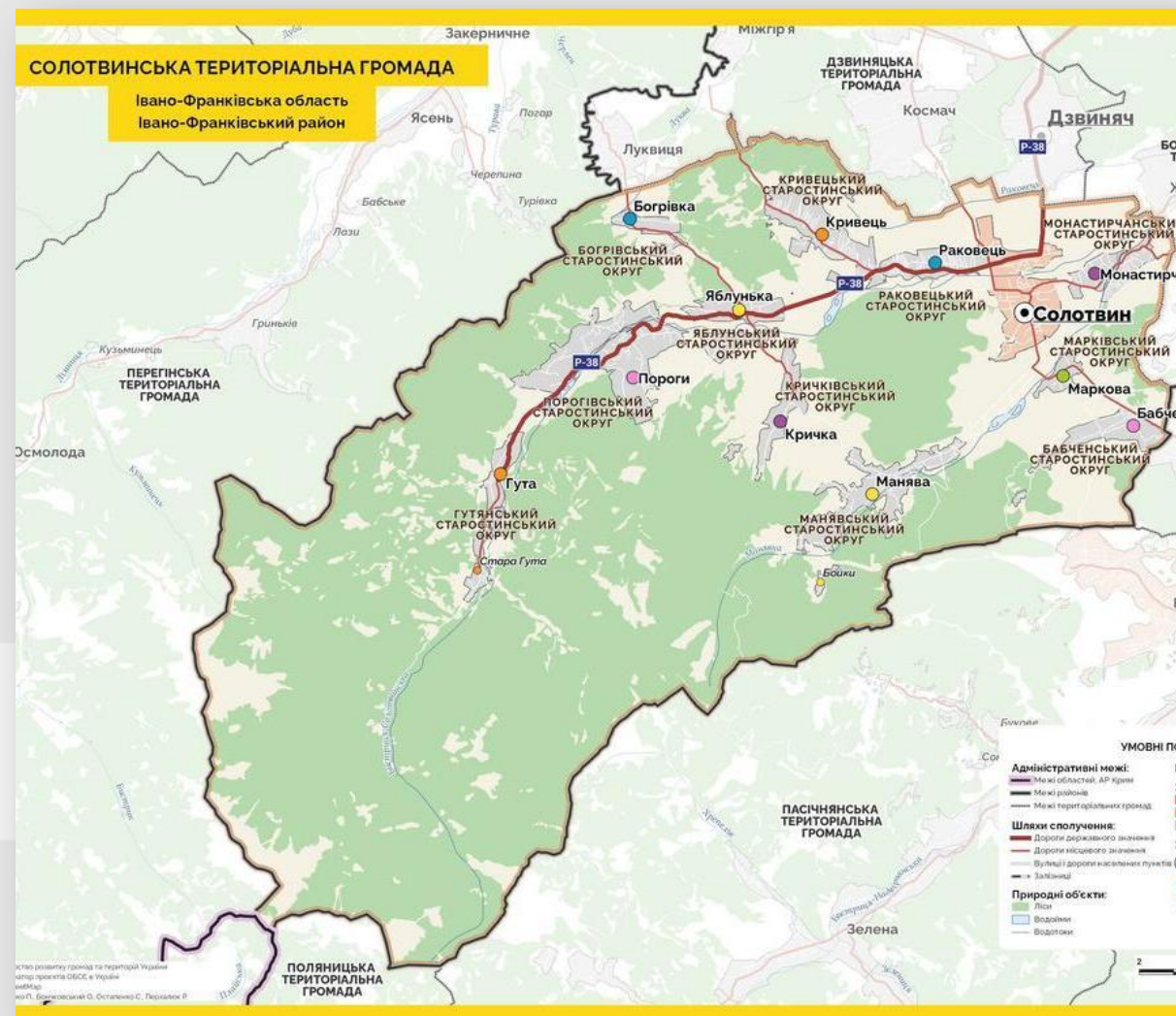

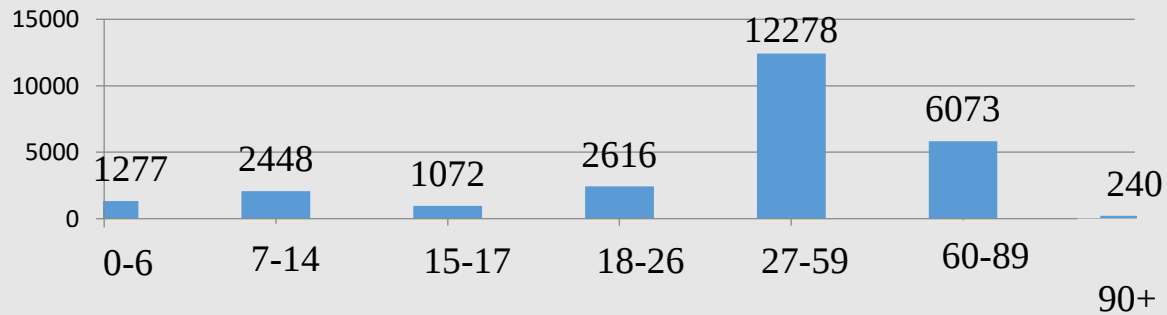


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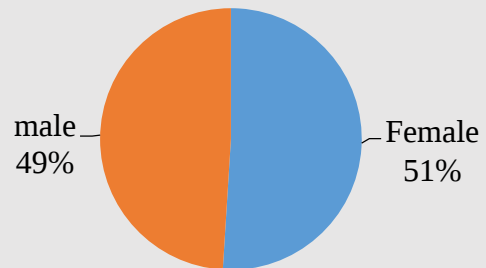

Age Structure of the Population

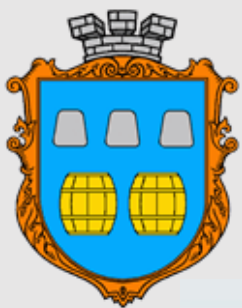

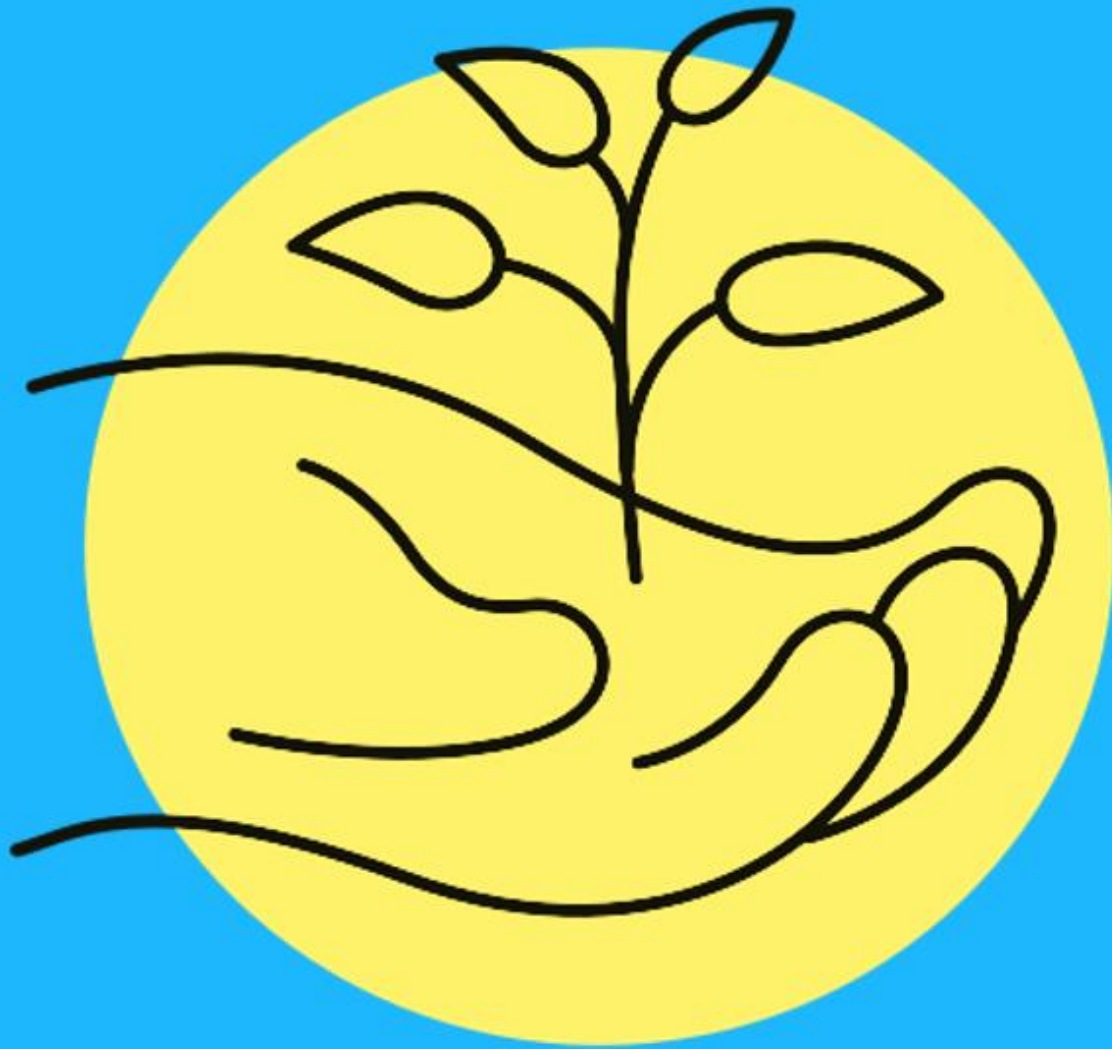

CLIMATE PROFILE

The climate of the community is humid continental, featuring cool summers and mild winters. The average July temperature ranges from +18°C in the lowland areas to +12°C ... +16°C in the mountainous areas, while the average January temperature is between -4°C and -6°C.

Physiographically, the territory of the Solotvyn Community is diverse and divided into three landscape zones: lowland, foothill, and mountain. Its highest point is Mount Velyka Syvulya, standing at 1,836 m above sea level.

The main watercourses of the community are the Bystrytsia Solotvynska River and the Manyavka River.

Bystrytsia Solotvynska originates from springs at the foot of Mount Mala Syvulya and Mount Bystryk, near the Peklo precipice, in the highest section of the Gorgany mountain range, at an altitude of 1,390 m above sea level. The total length of the river is 84 km. Numerous rapids and waterfalls are located along the river and its tributaries, including Malyi Kuzmynets, Rakovetskyi, Manyavskyi, Pid Komynom, Pid Komynom Verkhniy, and others..



The Manyavka River is a right tributary of the Bystrytsia Solotvynska River. It originates on the southeastern slopes of the Chortka Mountain Range (1,259 m) in the Komarnyky area. It flows primarily to the northeast past Mount Kichera (911.8 m), passing through the villages of Manyava, Markova, and Monastyrchany.

Main Soil Types: Sod-podzolic soils and podzolized gravelly brown forest soils.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LOGISTICS

Administrative Center and Regional Connections

The administrative center of the community, the settlement of Solotvyn, is located 40 km from the regional center, the city of Ivano-Frankivsk. The nearest city is Nadvirna, situated 22 km from the settlement. The regional highway of state importance **P-38 Bohorodchany – Huta**, which leads to the "Synyohora" State Residence, runs through the territory of the Solotvyn Community.



The total length of state highways passing through the settlements of the community is 19.3 km. Public local roads of regional (oblast) and district (rayon) importance run through several settlements within the community:

Regional Road O-090101 (Rosilna – Nadvirna) passes through the villages of Rakovets, Solotvyn, Markova, and Babche, with a total length of 14 km.

District Roads (total length of 25 km):

C-090107 Krychka – Rosilna

C-090106 Markova – Manyava

C-090105 Ivanykivka – Monastyrchany

C-090125 Huta – Stara Huta

The settlements within the community have reliable bus services, including frequent intercity connections to the regional center (*Ivano-Frankivsk*) and nearby district centers.

- Registered Carriers:** 14 business entities operate within the community, providing cargo and passenger transport services.

- Bus Routes:** The transport network includes 23 intercity and suburban bus routes traversing the territory of the community.

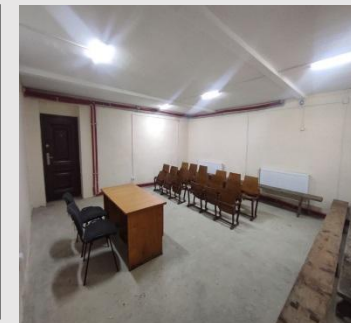

Educational Network Structure

The educational network of the Solotvyn Territorial Community comprises:

• **12 General Education Institutions:**

- **7 Lyceums** (*providing primary, basic, and complete secondary education*)
- **5 Gymnasiums** (*providing primary and basic secondary education*)

• **1 Out-of-School Education Center** (*extracurricular educational facilities*)

• **1 Children and Youth Sports School (CYSS)**

• **1 Inclusive Resource Center** (*supporting students with special educational needs*)

• **School Transportation Fleet:** 7 school buses

For preschool children, 4 preschool educational institutions operate (Solotvyn Preschool Educational Institution No. 1 "Dzvinochok", Solotvyn Preschool Educational Institution No. 2 "Strumochok", Yablunka Preschool Educational Institution "Edelweiss", Porohy Preschool Educational Institution "Dzhereltse") and 8 preschool divisions of general secondary education institutions. The Children's Music School, the Children and Youth Sports School, and clubs based at the Out-of-School Education Center contribute to the development of young talents. Academic olympiads, fairs, and youth competitions are held annually...

Sports Infrastructure of the Community: Football pitches – 5, sports grounds – 9 (including 5 with artificial turf). Sports grounds with artificial turf – 5 (Babche village, Markova village, Bohrivka village, Solotvyn settlement, Rakovets village). Regular free transportation of students to and from school by school buses is organized.

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HEALTH CARE

Medical services in the community are provided by the Municipal Non-Profit Enterprise "Solotvyn Hospital ". The capacity of the hospital is 95 inpatient bed spaces.

The hospital comprises 7 departments:

- Therapeutic
- Surgical
- Neurological
- Gynecological
- Pediatric
- Palliative
- Outpatient (*polyclinic*)



Additionally, the Municipal Non-Profit Enterprise "Solotvyn Hospital" operates a primary healthcare department, which includes 3 general practice and family medicine outpatient clinics: in Solotvyn settlement, Markova village, and Monastyrchany village.

Feldsher stations are located in Babche village, Rakovets village, Kryvets village, and Krychka village; health points are located in Huta village, Stara Huta village, and Bohrivka village.

The Municipal Non-Profit Enterprise "Solotvyn Hospital" is equipped with modern medical equipment that meets contemporary healthcare standards and enhances the quality of medical services provided in the community.



The Palliative Care Department of the Municipal Non-Profit Enterprise "Solotvyn Hospital" is equipped with a modern elevator to ensure accessibility and enhance the quality of specialized palliative care provided to palliative patients.



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CULTURE

Culture and history form the foundation that provides depth and richness to the national identity of every community. Cultural vitality is as essential as a robust economy or social cohesion. A significant portion of the municipal infrastructure is dedicated to delivering services in the cultural sector.

The municipal property of the community includes:

13 Cultural Centers: 1 Central House of Culture, 3 Community Houses of Culture, and 9 Village Cultural Clubs

14 Libraries: 1 Central Public Library, 1 Children's Library, and 12 Library Branches

1 Children's Music School

1 Museum: Oleksandr Fedanko Museum of Folk Art

Cultural Life & Traditional Heritage

Community members actively participate in and attend vibrant cultural events, including festivals, art exhibitions, pre-Easter and pre-Christmas workshops, and charity events.

The community actively preserves and revives ancient Ukrainian traditions:

Easter Celebrations: Traditional outdoor Easter games and songs (*Haivky / Hahilky*)

Winter Cycle Rituals: Authentic Christmas and *Malanka* festivities, alongside interactive performances featuring winter folk songs and traditional rites

In order to engage and mobilize community residents, festivals, cultural, artistic, and entertainment events are regularly held. Creative performance ensembles from the community participated in the 5th International Festival "Kolyada in the Carpathians" in the Republic of Poland and actively participate in all-Ukrainian competitions.



Cultural life is thriving across the Solotvyn Territorial Community! Over time, the richness and intensity of our cultural and social initiatives will only continue to grow, as community members actively nurture their spiritual and cultural development.



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CULTURAL HERITAGE AND TOURISM





Not far from the waterfall lies the Manyava Skete, also known as the Exaltation of the Holy Cross Monastery, historically referred to as the Ukrainian Mount Athos—a stronghold of Orthodoxy founded in the 17th century by the monk Yov Knyahynytskyi. The architectural monastery complex is an ensemble of brick, stone, and wooden structures surrounded by a high defensive wall with towers and loopholes. The monastery is washed on all sides by mountain waters. The monastery is subordinated to the Orthodox Church of Ukraine.



In the Prykarpattia region, spiritual sanctuaries are held in deep reverence. Every village within the community has its own unique sacred site, which serves as a spiritual core for the village's development. A well-known sanctuary of the community is the Monastery of Saint Seraphim of Sarov in Kryvets village.



A prominent local architectural landmark is the Church of the Nativity of the Most Holy Mother of God (UGCC) in Solotvyn settlement, which was consecrated back in 1903. The church was built according to the design of the Ukrainian architect Vasyl Nahirnyi, renowned for his sacred architecture. A bell tower has been preserved alongside the church.

A historic spirit also lingers in Babche village, where the Church of Saint Archangel Michael—a local architectural landmark—has been preserved to this day. The church was constructed in 1805. It is in this very church that a Gospel dating back to 1743 is preserved.

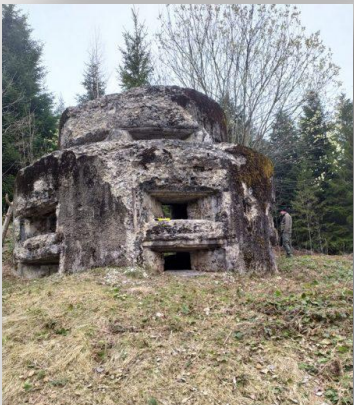


The Church of Saint Paraskeva Pyatnytsia in Krychka already existed in 1680 and was recorded in the Cathedra of the Eparchy of Lviv for that year. A church was also present in the village in 1783. The extant wooden church dates back to 1820. According to local lore, the church and bell tower were originally located at the Manyava Skete. The monastery later sold them to the Solotvyn parish, after which the structures were transported to Krychka.

In Solotvyn settlement stands one of the tallest statues of Jesus Christ in Ukraine, measuring 5.5 meters in height. The statue is cradled by the Solotvyn Oaks—a local botanical natural monument in Ukraine. The status was granted under Decree No. 451 of the Regional State Administration on July 15, 1996, to preserve a group of 12 century-old oak trees. The largest among them have a trunk circumference of 6.8 and 7 meters and an estimated age exceeding 350 years.



Another historical landmark in the community is the pillboxes (DOTs / permanent weapon emplacements) from World War I, located in Bohrivka village. They hold valuable historical heritage that attracts interested tourists. The line of pillboxes in Bohrivka was built to defend the road passing through the village against the Russian army. In total, there are 9 pillboxes in Bohrivka village: 8 are single-level, and one is a rare three-level structure featuring three "tiers" of embrasures. A significant advantage is that the pillboxes are remarkably well preserved. The Bohrivka pillboxes stand as witnesses to our region's history—a tangible piece of heritage that people can see and understand.





The Solotvyn Community is a picturesque and inviting region of the Prykarpattia, stretching along the Bystrytsia Solotvynska River in the foothills of the Gorgany mountain range. Community life seamlessly blends dynamic modernity with authentic local culture.

A hallmark of pride for the community is the Synyohora National Nature Park, located on the outskirts of Huta village. The park was established to preserve, restore, and sustainably manage the representative and unique ecosystems of the Gorgany mountain range (Ukrainian Carpathians), which hold immense environmental, scientific, aesthetic, recreational, and wellness significance.

Huta Village: Gateway to the Wild Carpathians

One of the most attractive tourist destinations in the community is the village of Huta. Huta serves as the threshold between civilization and pristine wilderness—a portal transporting visitors from dusty, crowded cities into a tranquil and picturesque mountain realm.

A defining feature of the village is that the asphalt highway terminates just beyond its borders, opening directly into breathtaking mountain landscapes and the legendary Gorgany range. Standing near Huta is Mount Syvulya (1,836 m)—the highest peak of the Gorgany.

The most prominent peaks include Mount Mala Syvulya (1,818 m), Mount Ihrovets (1,804 m), Mount Tavpysh (1,450 m)



Not far from Mount Velyka Syvulya lies Urochyshche Peklo ("Hell Ravine")—a mystical gem of the Ukrainian Carpathians. Looking at its geological cross-section, it offers a striking visual illustration of how marine sediment layers formed during ancient geological epochs. The name of the ravine carries a grim tone, tied both to its stark, dramatic landscapes and to local historical accounts stating that mass executions of Jews took place here during the wartime period.



A major tourist magnet of the community is the Manyava Waterfall, located in Manyava village. The Manyava Waterfall is a hydrological natural monument. The waterfall is situated on the Manyavka River (a tributary of the Bystrytsia Solotvynska), within a picturesque gorge amidst steep mountain slopes. With a water drop height of approximately 20 meters, it is one of the highest waterfalls in the Ukrainian Carpathians.

On the outskirts of the village lies the Synyohora Residence.

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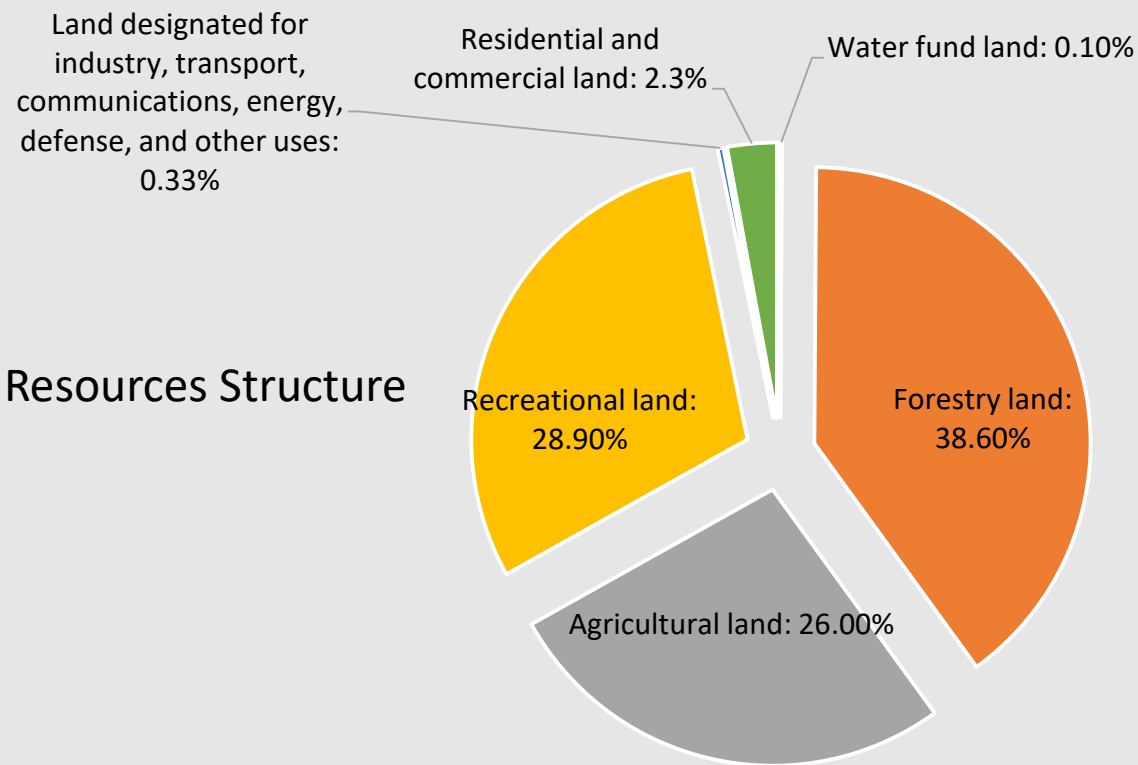

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Land Resources Structure



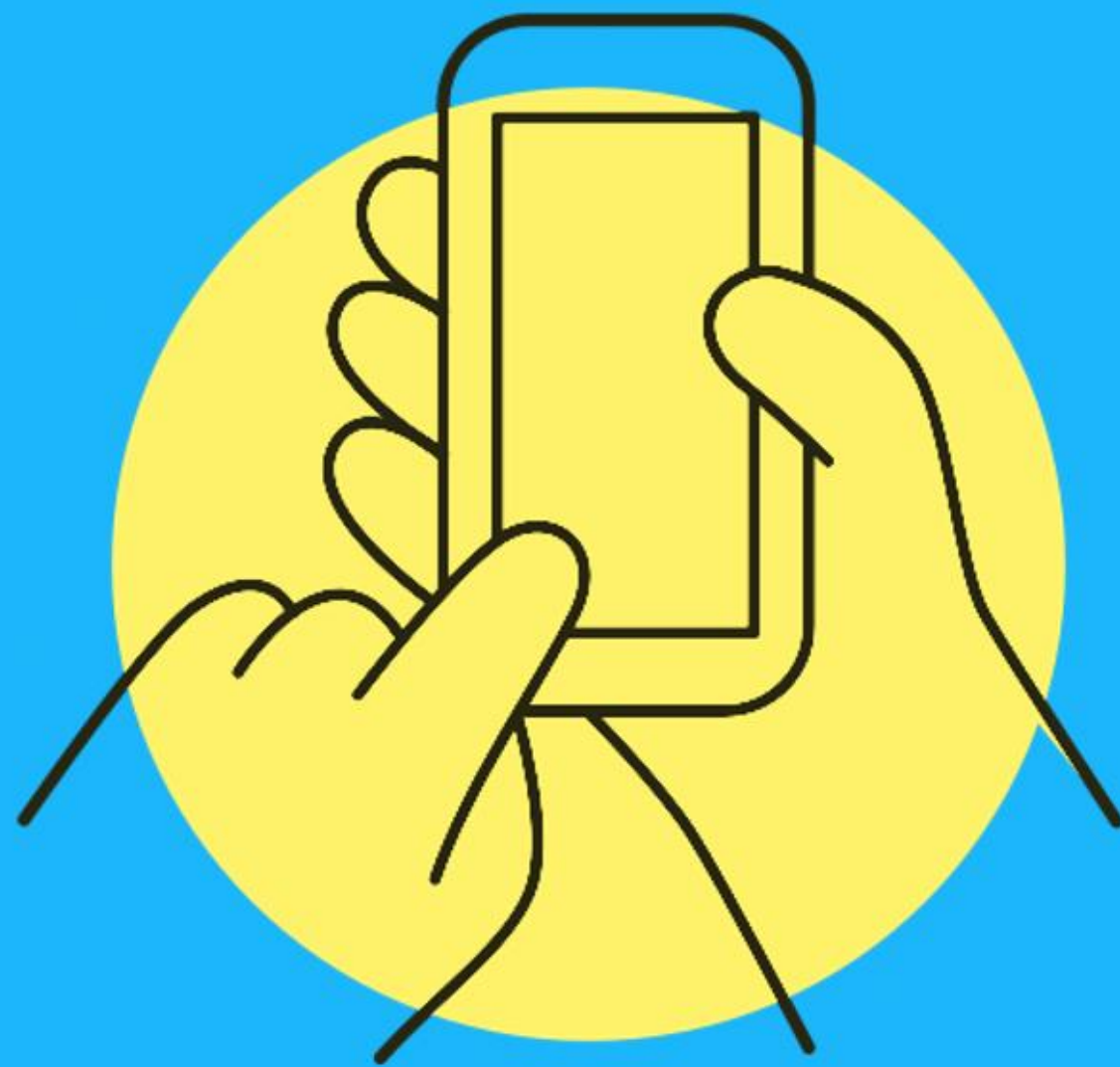

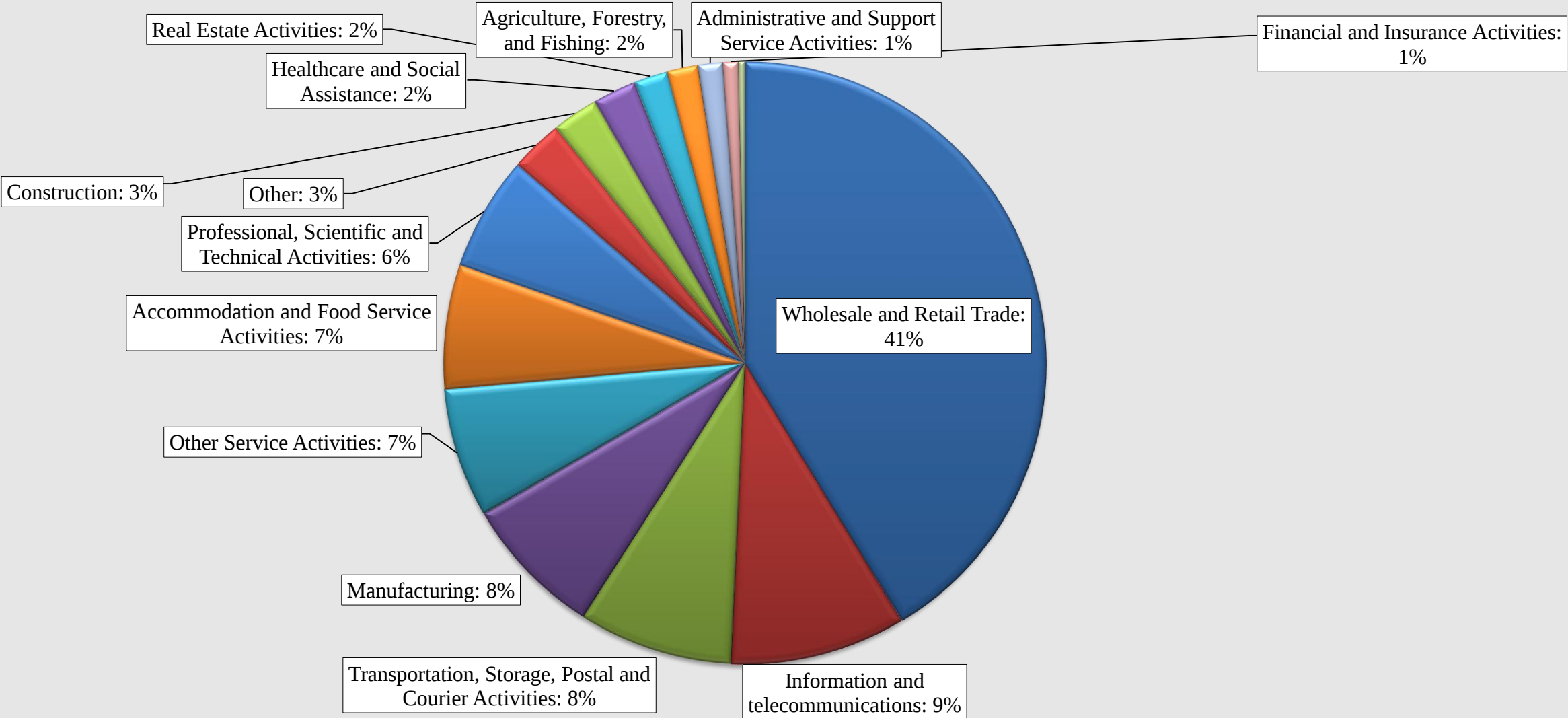

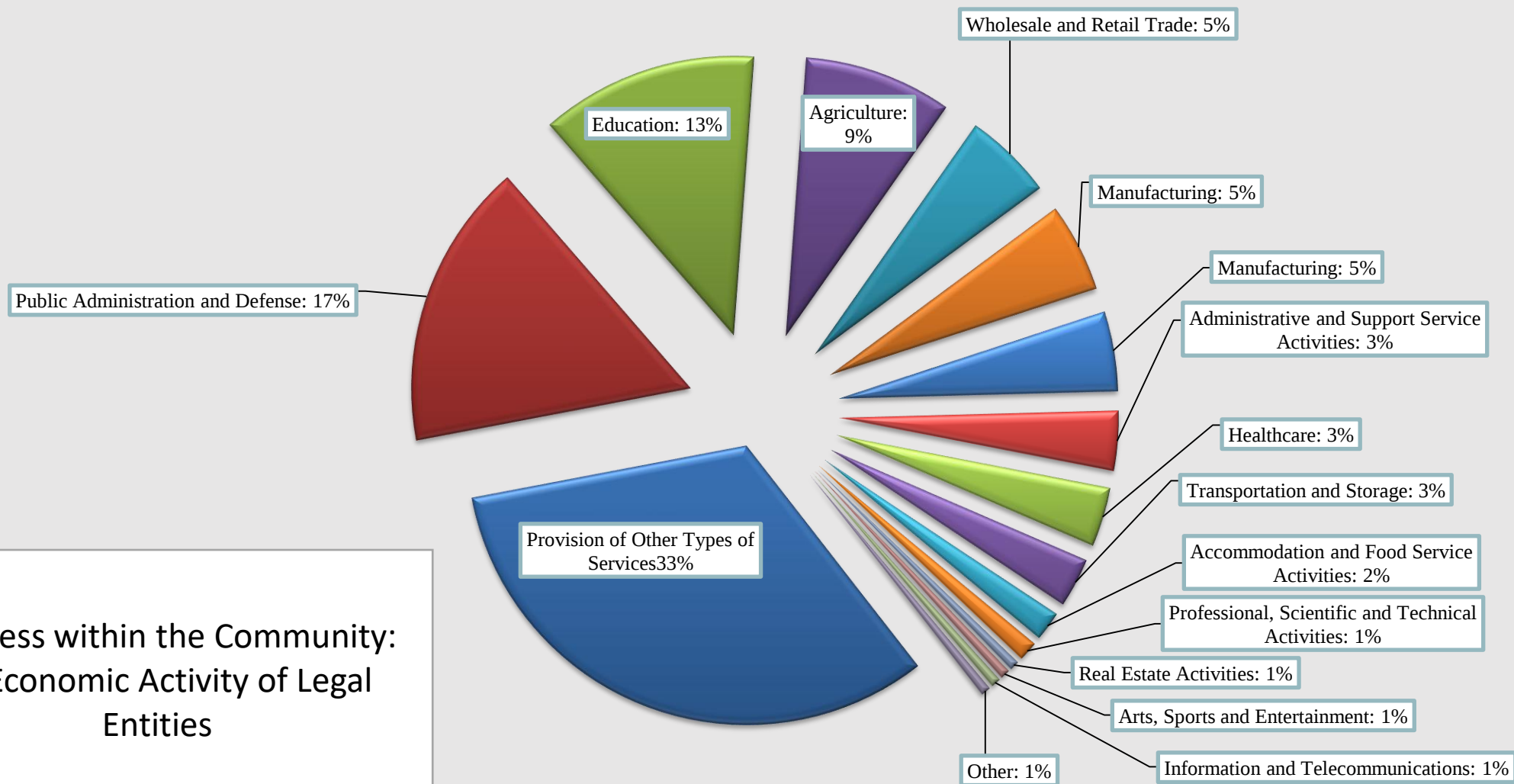

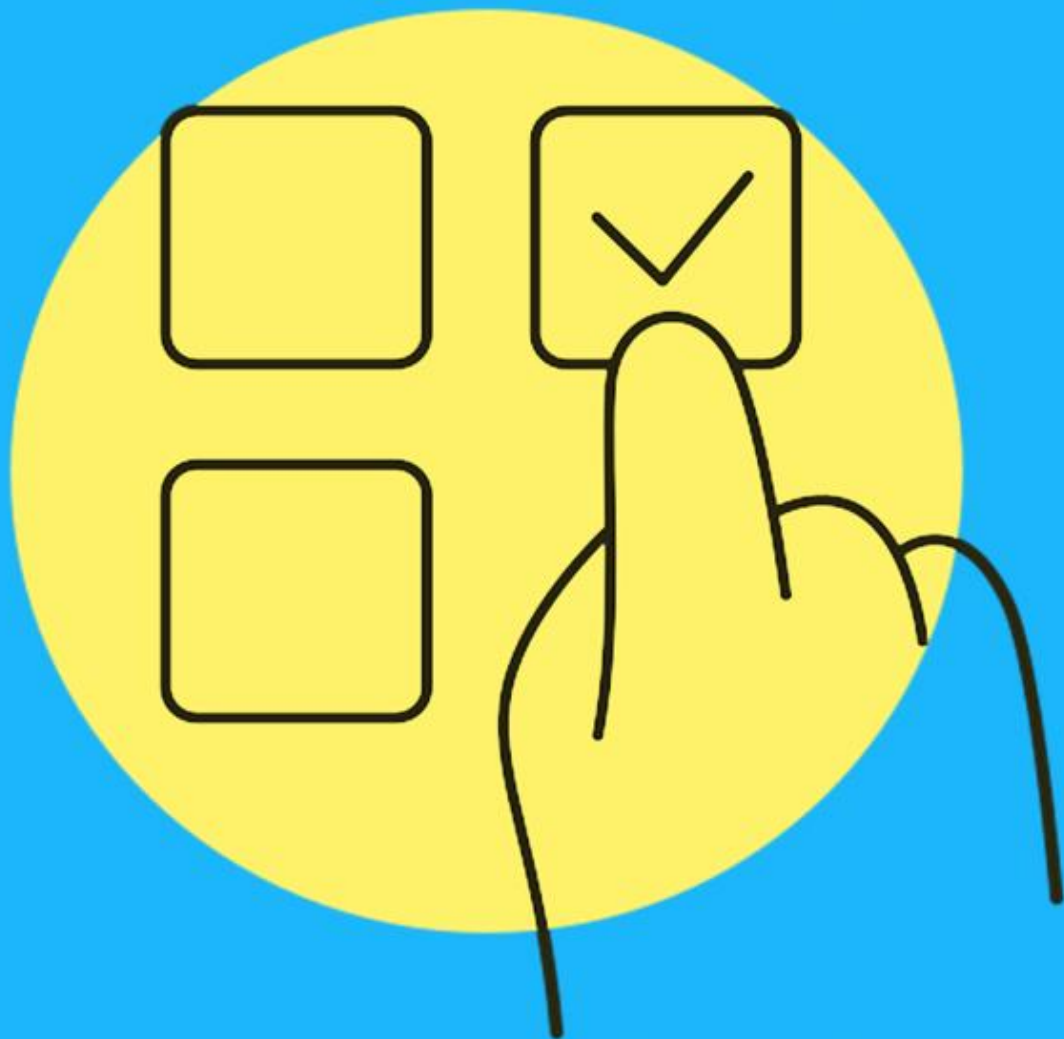

- Memorandum of Cooperation with the Charitable Organization "Charity Foundation 'Rokada'", aimed at identifying and meeting the needs of internally displaced persons (IDPs) residing within the community.
- Inter-Municipal Cooperation Agreement on Delegating Specific Tasks (in the field of urban planning and architecture) between the Lysets and Solotvyn Territorial Communities.

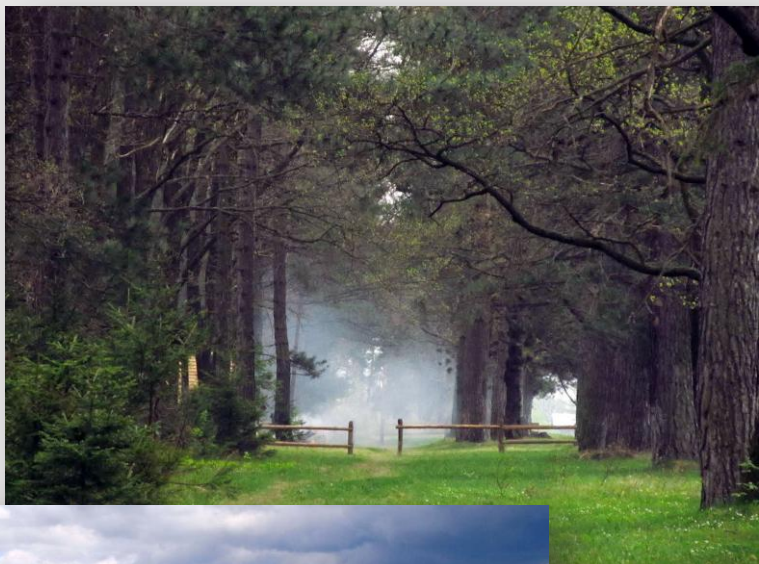
